We are writing to offer our enthusiastic support for Eastern Market as the recipient of a 2014 Committee of 100 Vision Award, applied for by the Eastern Market Community Advisory Committee. This position was taken at a regularly scheduled and properly noticed meeting of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6B with a quorum present and was adopted by a vote of 10-0.

Eastern Market sits at the geographic center of our commission and for the last 140 years in its current location has been a mainstay for community life on Capitol Hill. While many historic assets in our community and City have been preserved or maintained, outside of the key federal entities that have served at the core of our democracy, Eastern Market represents one of the few if not only institutions that has maintained not only its form, but its original purpose and impact on the community.
